I would especially like to thank (once again) the Shanklea Team who have continued to work exceptionally hard to ensure that all our pupils are able to continue with their learning. I hope that all our home learners have continued to find accessing the work via the Google Classroom to be straight-forward and helpful. Although nothing can replace the impact of students being in school to receive the direct instruction and immediate feedback from their teachers, the use of the Google Classroom has enabled us to provide the students with the next best thing. With home learning continuing next term, please remember to refer to the teachers' curriculum overviews and guidance, including some very clear and helpful video tutorials, to support children and parents in navigating their learning. Home and school make a great team.



Please encourage children to **check for feedback** on the Google Classroom, Busy Things and Purple Mash. These look different in different places but usually there will be an alert to tell the children they have a message or there will be an area with '**my messages**' or it may appear on the task when it is returned. If there is a play or audio symbol this will mean the children have an audio message from their teacher.

As I've said previously, if you have any concerns because too much or too little work is being set, or the guidance is not

















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sufficient, then please ask your son/daughter to email the relevant teacher or contact them via the Google Classroom to raise their concerns or to ask politely for help and we'll establish how to manage appropriately any concern.

I would also like to thank all the Shanklea Team for helping to provide so much care to the children during these very challenging times. They have not just been providing much needed pastoral and wellbeing support but have helped many of our pupils to organise their time and to establish good working practices, which will prove invaluable as they progress.

Please note that we are not expecting pupils to complete work over the half-term holiday.

We would encourage all of our students (and their families) to use the time to rest and recharge in preparation for the next term. We have included some ideas for things to do later in this newsletter.



Half term holidays begin Friday 12th February 2021 @3.15pm

The Prime Minister has confirmed that all pupils will not return to school after February half term and that the Government believes it should be safe be to commence the reopening of schools from Monday 8th March 2021.

From Monday 22nd February, Shanklea Primary School will be open to vulnerable pupils and children of key workers while other pupils will continue to learn from home. We understand how frustrating this can be for everyone - parents, teachers and pupils. But we will set out further details on our approach to opening the school up to more pupils as part of the wider plan for leaving lockdown. To confirm, we hope it will be safe to start reopening more widely from 8th March, subject to the data. Education is a national priority and we want our school to open fully as soon as the public health situation allows.
