The Children's Voice

At Shanklea Primary School, the School Council gives all children a meaningful voice. At the start of the year, each class elects a school council representative. 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Social Media—an important message

Our school is continually looking for new and innovative ways to increase communication with our parent community. As it has been widely recognised that social media is one of such ways, we have created an official Shanklea Facebook page. This page is intended to share **positive** events, trips and celebrations with the Shanklea community.

On Facebook, our Shanklea page, and individuals' pages, may be viewed by many members of the Shanklea community and it is very important that all posts referencing Shanklea and its community are in compliance with our published code of conduct, GDPR regulations and indeed Facebook's own rules. This means that photographs of children may only be posted with parental permission and that children are not tagged or named by anybody. Privacy rules must be followed and there must be no discussion relating to individuals. **Abuse of any member of the school community or negative comments of any kind, including criticism of school and its policies can be very damaging and is unacceptable.**

The school administrators regularly monitor our Facebook site and will remove comments that do not adhere to our rules of engagement. We also strive to monitor references to our school and its community generally. **We take very seriously inappropriate use of social media by anyone to publicly humiliate or criticise another parent/carer, member of staff or child.**

We appreciate that sometimes parents or carers may have concerns or feel dissatisfaction about something relating to our school. In such cases, they should address any issues or concerns regarding school life through official school channels rather than posting them on social networking sites. We strongly encourage them to contact us so that we may resolve the situation to everyone's satisfaction. Our Head Teacher, Mrs Brown is on the yard every morning and is readily available to talk to families.

Please read our Facebook Code of Conduct if you haven't already done so (it was included in last week's newsletter). We are keen to avoid any problems relating to social media use and trust we can all continue to communicate effectively and work together in the best interests of our children and the wider Shanklea community.
