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World Mental Health Day



Say #HelloYellow on World Mental Health Day

Shanklea Primary School joined thousands of schools, offices and workplaces up and down the country and wore yellow on Thursday 10 October 2019 for World Mental Health Day. Whether they chose a subtle splash of colour or dressed like sunshine from head-to-toe, together we showed young people they are not alone with their mental health.

Shanklea Primary School is also supporting ITV's 'Britain Get Talking' which is a Mental Wellness campaign to help families get closer.

There is clear evidence that building good relationships – with family, friends and our wider community – is positive for our wellbeing. Having strong relationships means that we can share our feelings and know we're being understood. It means we can support those around us as well if they are going through a difficult time.

When children and young people are struggling with their mental health, it can be particularly hard for them to talk openly about what they're going through. That's why we encourage parents and carers to have regular conversations with their children about how they're feeling from a young age.

Along with Mind, we're pleased to support Britain Get Talking who have advice on their website on how families can have those conversations, and how parents and other adults can support young people if they're struggling with their mental health.

YoungMinds Crisis Messenger

The YoungMinds Crisis Messenger text service provides free, 24/7 crisis support across the UK. If a child is experiencing a mental health crisis and need support, they can text YM to 85258. We know that finding the right support is important, especially if they need someone to talk to right now. The service aim to connect every texter to a trained volunteer promptly to provide crisis help. They will listen to you and help you think more clearly, enabling you to know that you can take the next step to feeling better.

The YoungMinds Crisis Messenger is powered by the Shout and Crisis Text Line. It is free and confidential to text the service from the following major networks: EE, O2, Three, Vodafone, BT Mobile, Tesco Mobile, Virgin Mobile, iD Mobile, Sky, Telecom Plus, Lebara and GiffGaff. Some Android phones issue a warning that you will be charged for texting them, but provided you are on one of these networks this warning is incorrect and you will not be charged. If you text them from a network that is not on this list there is a possibility that you may be charged for the messages and that they may appear on your bill, this is because some networks do not provide the capability to message short codes.

How does it work?

The trained volunteer will introduce themselves, reflect on what you've said, and invite you to share how you're feeling. You'll text each other, only sharing what you feel comfortable with. By asking questions, listening to you and responding with support, they will help you think through your feelings until you both feel you are now in a calm, safe place. You might be signposted to other services, so that you can continue to get support.

The crisis messenger service can help with urgent issues such as:

- Suicidal thoughts
- Abuse or assault
- Self-harm
- Bullying
- Relationship issues

Any pupil can text free and anonymously – although if the volunteer believes they are at immediate risk of harm, they may share details with people who can provide support.

IMPORTANT REMINDER



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The Northumbria Mini Police is an engagement scheme designed to improve citizenship within our communities and give young children the opportunity to learn about their safety, their role within their community and how the police work within the community to keep us safe.

The scheme is aimed at children in Year 5 and focuses on the contribution young people can make into our communities to make it a better place to be. The scheme will improve the relationship between the police and the communities they serve and gives young people a voice to say what matters to them and to influence people around them in a positive way.

We are delighted to tell you that Shanklea Primary School has been successful in our bid to join the scheme.

Our Year 5 Children will be visited by the Mini Police team who will explain what we do, what the children will be asked to do and to show the work we have done before. Class teachers will then decide on a group of ten children who would like to take part –this is not based on academic ability but on children who will enthusiastically join in with all of the activities. In order to take part, parents and class teachers must sign a consent form and be fully supportive.

Once they have joined the Mini Police Team, the children will take part in a session to work on topics such as water safety, healthy relationships, online safety and many other topics. Sessions will be interactive and tailored to suit each separate Mini Police group and the community they live in.

After this, it will be their job to then tell the rest of the school all about what they have learned. They are the Mini Police for our school and very important in helping Northumbria Police to spread important messages about keeping safe. Our Mini Police group will then come out into the community with the Mini Police team. What we do will depend on what is happening in our area but examples of community work include helping out at the Great North Run, carrying out surveys with residents to help improve the area, helping at the Sunderland Air Show and many other things. After this we will arrange an exciting visit to some of the different departments within the police so the children can learn more about what police officers do. This might be a trip to see the police horses at the mounted section, visiting the control room to listen to 999 calls and watch how we manage our officers out and about and even a visit to the helicopter.

Children will be given a uniform to wear as part of the Mini Police. Their uniform will consist of a cap, waterproof jacket and hi-viz vest each with the logo on. This means they can easily be seen and be safe when out in the community with us. The police we will carefully assess any risks there might be and a parent, teacher or guardian will always be present.

We are confident the selected children (and the entire Shanklea community) will benefit enormously from taking part in this great initiative.
