## **Weekly Newsletter**

### **Return to school**

It has been a very positive return to school for all of our pupils. They are all looking extremely smart in their Shanklea School uniform and it is wonderful to see their happy faces. Hearing the familiar laughter, chatter and bustle of a full school has been truly wonderful.

During the lockdown period many of the pupils really missed the face to face interaction with their friends so the staff have given them plenty of opportunities to talk and reconnect with each other in school. The daily timetable has included 'wellbeing' activities which enable the pupils to relax and express how they are feeling.

The pupils are also continuing to access their core areas of learning in reading, writing, maths and phonics (for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils). Every year group also has Topic based learning and this enables the pupils to apply their core areas of learning to other subjects.

We are ensuring that the pupils stay in their year group bubbles and they have been very sensible during the school day.

### Drop off and pick up

We appreciate the cooperation of parents and carers with the drop off and pick up arrangements for our pupils.

Please can all adults wear a face mask on the school premises and keep your social distance.

Each morning, if your child is able to walk to their class on their own please say goodbye to them at the gate as this will alleviate congestion in the playground. A member of staff is present at the each of the school gates. Please do not block the gate entrances so that other parents/carers can enter and exit the school premises safely and leave the premises promptly once you have dropped off or collected your child.

If you are collecting siblings they can be collected at the same time by prior arrangement. Pupils who walk home on their own will be dismissed by their teachers at the school gate.

Despite the success of the walking and scooting to school initiative, we have had a few concerned parents contact me this week about the use of scooters around the school. It is wonderful to see that the children are excited to use their scooters, however, with health and safety in mind please can we ask that that you ensure children refrain from scooting by the school gates, on school property and surrounding areas. Thank you in advance for

















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your co-operation.

Whilst the number of positive Covid-19 cases identified in our communities is reducing, those cases are only a small percentage of the people who potentially have the infection as many will not have any symptoms. It is likely that the number of cases remains relatively high; the infection is still being spread; and we know that cases can escalate very quickly if the conditions are right and



people mix unnecessarily, for instance by continuing to hold events such as children's birthday parties. With our school now fully reopened, it is vital that we all continue to do everything we can to prevent the spread of Covid-19. Earlier this week, we forwarded families a letter from the Directors of Public Health and NCC Children's Services with more information.

The Government has outlined the roadmap out of lockdown, but the current 'stay at home' rules are not due to be relaxed until 29th March at the earliest. This means no indoor mixing of households, unless you are in a single person household support bubble, or a childcare bubble. We have had increasing reports of Shanklea pupils gathering in groups outside of school hours in local parks and we would like to remind you that this is still illegal and risks financial penalties being issued by the Police. While it may not sound risky for pupils to mix outside of school in groups, the level of risk is much higher than during the school day when they are socially distanced, wearing masks, and using hand sanitiser regularly.

We therefore ask that you ensure you, and your children are aware of the current rules and guidance, and that you know where they are at all times. You can only leave your home for essential shopping, or for exercise. You can exercise with your household or support bubble, or you can meet with one person from outside your household. Please continue to maintain social distancing at all times, including when exercising, and when dropping off and collecting your children from school.

If you or someone in your household develops symptoms, please arrange a Covid test for that person, and isolate your whole household immediately. If the result is positive, the household must isolate for 10 full days. If the result is negative, you can stop isolating.

## **Reading Research**


Did you know that turning on the subtitles while children are watching television can double the chances of a child becoming good at reading?


