Keep informed

We work really hard to ensure families are kept up-to-date with all our plans and activities at Shanklea Primary School.

We are increasingly using paperless communication to keep you informed,. For example we send texts and emails for shorter messages about particular subjects. These can be to large groups (e.g. class reminders) or to individual families. We use the School Gateway to allow families to book (and pay for) OOSC, Breakfast Club and extra-curricular activities and to give permission for various things (see above). Families can pre-order and pay for their child's lunches, and update their child's food allergy information on School Grid.

Newsletters are produced weekly and give us an opportunity to share more detailed information on specific subjects and, of course, to celebrate children's successes and achievements. This week, we have included an initial programme of events for this term. Please note however, that new events and activities are added throughout the term so you should look out for texts, emails and other newsletters,


Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas
