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
Collective Worship

Worship is central to our daily lives here at Shanklea Primary School. All children in school participate in M our daily act of collective worship and weekly themes and bible verses are shared with the school community. We believe that we are all joined together as a special community and parents and friends of the school are invited to worship with us whenever possible. We are very fortunate to have a number of people in school who lead worship including the head teacher, the deputy head teachers, the clergy team of St Nicholas' Church, Cramlington Village, the children, teaching staff and leaders from other local churches. The school takes part in a number of church events each year including the Remembrance Service and the annual Harvest and Carol Services. Clergy team play an active part in the life of the school and there are excellent links between us.

Opportunities for reflection and private prayer are readily available inside our school building. Children are encouraged to engage with the reflection space through either viewing diverse religious artefacts from across the globe or engaging in reflection activities. 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Attendance

Children can't help being sick occasionally. Sometimes they have an illness that will require time off school and a visit to a doctor. On these occasions , it is very important that you let school know as soon as possible, via text, phone, email or by calling in to talk to us.

Regularly taking one or two days off though soon adds up. Sometimes our children have coughs or colds. They may not feel like their normal self but they are probably well enough for school. Children have to learn for adult life that we need to build our resilience to cope. If as adults we regularly took time off work for a cough or cold we wouldn't have a job.

As parents/carers we are asking you to stop and think before you allow your child to stay off school.

- Are they well enough to attend school?
- Is your child's attendance already a concern?
- Would it help if you dropped off paracetamol or medication for them during the school day? If so just sign the appropriate form in school.
- Is there anything worrying your child at school or home?

Who could you speak to?

- Class teacher
- Head Teacher/ Deputy Head Teachers
- Attendance Admin Officer Mrs McConnell

If a parent wishes to request a period of leave of absence they are required to write to the Head Teacher by completing the appropriate leave of absence form which can be collected from the office. This should be done before any flights, holiday bookings or other arrangements are made.

There is no entitlement to time off in term time.

A school can only grant Leave of Absence if

- A request for leave of absence is submitted before leave is taken
- And the Head Teacher believes the reason is exceptional

Leave of absence can only be granted for exceptional circumstances. A holiday or travelling abroad is not considered exceptional.

There are 38 weeks in the year when school is open and 14 weeks (175 DAYS) when families can visit family overseas; go on holiday; travel or attend non urgent

medical appointments. So before you ask for leave of absence please consider... Is your request for leave of absence exceptional?

If the request is denied the school will inform the parent of the reason and the request will be noted in the electronic register.

The Rules concerning unauthorised absences are as follows:

Absence taken and not authorised could be liable for a Fixed Penalty fine of £60 per parent, per child. This fine will double to £120 if not paid within 21 days. Unpaid fines will result in court proceedings leading to a criminal record for unpaid fines.

If unauthorised leave is taken on a second occasion fixed penalty notices will be issued again at £60 per parent, per child. Again the fine will double to £120 if not paid within 21 days.

If unauthorised leave is taken on a third occasion <u>no Penalty Notice will be issued and that parent will be taken straight to Court under the higher-level aggravated offence.</u> This means that the parent may be subject to a much more severe penalty i.e. a maximum fine of up to £2,500 or 3 months in custody or, a community order which may involve them doing a number of hours of unpaid work.

Leave of absence forms are available from outside the office. If you have any concerns please contact us. Together, we can help the children "be the best they can be"


- Ensure that your posts are not breaching school security procedures.
