Weekly Newsletter

It has been so lovely to welcome our children back in to school, along with some new faces. There is a lovely buzz around the school with lots of children keen to chatter to their friends and catch up again.

The overwhelming feeling from the children is that they are delighted to be back and to see their teachers and friends and have really enjoyed their schooling. They have quickly settled down to their work and established good working routines – long may this continue! On behalf of us all, we'd like to wish you a Happy Easter and say a big 'thank you' to everyone for your hard work over the past few weeks.

Another term has come and gone. Easter time holidays are with us again! Sadly for a second year running everyone is going to have to celebrate Easter differently due to the ongoing coronavirus restrictions. This year Easter takes place between Friday April 2 and Monday April 5 2021. The usual customs of the festival, a family meal and bank holiday celebrations, will again need to be adapted so we can all celebrate safely.

If cases remain low and people continue to take the vaccine when it is offered to them then the Government says it is planning to ease restrictions slightly from 29 March 2021. From that date, the stay at home rule will end and outdoor gatherings (including in private gardens) of either 6 people (the Rule of 6) or 2 households will also be allowed, making it easier for friends and families to meet outside. However people will need to remain cautious.

Northumberland County Council has advised that:

- if residents are planning on using the county parks for things like picnics then they are advised to stay away from busy areas, either coming back at a less busy time or moving to a less busy area of the park.
- Residents must remember to continue to follow 'hands, face, space'. It is important to remember to keep 2m away from those you do not live with or are not in a support bubble with the virus is still there and even if someone has had a dose of the vaccine, they could still carry and spread the virus unknowingly.
- Nonetheless try to get outdoors for some fresh air and fingers crossed there is no rain!

Positive Cases of Covid-19 during the Easter holidays

The Government has asked schools to support the NHS Test and Trace system during the start of the holidays in order to help reduce the spread of Covid-19.

If your child develops symptoms during the holidays, you should arrange for them to be tested.





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Please let us know if your child tests positive for Covid-19 AND their symptoms emerged within 48 hours of being in school (Saturday 27th or Sunday 28th) so that we can alert parents of children within that bubble and members of staff.

You should inform school by either Email or text message.

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
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Cramlington school says fond farewell to cook
